School master & author; living at Fancy Green, Ingleton with his wife, Margaret and six young children; age 41. 1901 Census: Occupation – Sewing Machine repairer; now living at 14 Horsemarket, Kirkby Lonsdale, with four children at home, the eldest working as a clerk.

Interesting appendix on Manorial rights and dispute. Section on the dispute over the naming of the Twiss, Doe and Greta.

Fond of statistics! Information on Kingsdale and Greygareth (Gragareth).

The personal map is interesting, in that it is very selective.
