His descriptive accounts of landscape features are interesting but there is not a great deal of local history. More facts/lists than analysis. Much of his information comes from the parish registers. Interesting appendix on Manorial rights and dispute. Section on the dispute over the naming of the Twiss, Doe and Greta. Fond of statistics! Information on Kingsdale and Greygareth (Gragareth). The personal map is interesting, in that it is very selective.

An easy book to read and very detailed on natural history and the landscape.
