Interesting potted biographies of Sedgwick, Otway, Barwick and Fox.
P.165 The sanctuary-men of the 15th century. Register Sanctuarium Dunelmense
pub. Surtees Society records of Durham Cathedral and Beverley Minster. 1478
Robert Richardson, labourer, and Edmund Moyser, tailor, of Sedbergh admitted
slaying Thomas Forster near the Holme ie. on the road between Dent and Middleton.
1479 Robert Burton of Dent indicted for stealing Henry Taylor's bull. 1486 Robert
Lonsdale & Christopher Lindsay claim immunity for the assassination of Laurence
Falshed (Fawcett?) in a brawl near Hallgill in Dent. 1507 Gilbert Guy of Garsdale
cattle lifting. P.166 Freeholders of Sedbergh " on account of their ffar remoteness
and poore estates" successfully petitioned the Justices of Assizes for the Northern
Circuit to delegate attendance to 2 reps. "whereby the rest may live in peace".
Anthony Fawcet of Dent & others issued tokens "pennies" & "farthings" ref. Baines
"Yorkshire Tokens". Useful chapter on the social & domestic life of the dalesmen.
Dent was a centre of industry and enterprise, larger than Sedbergh. Until 1863
Sedbergh had to vote in Dent. Interesting section on the parish accounts of Dent.
Bigland "Topography of Yorkshire" has half page on Dent.
P.250 reference to Kingsdale.
