1893 saw the maximum inrush of tourists. Estimated that at least 100,000 persons visited Ingleton that season. He describes the Falls Walk in detail. Twistleton Hall contains the pediment of a font bearing the initials TW and the date 1619. There was a pre-Reformation Chapel there mentioned in writs of remission of taxation issued by Edward 11 after Bannockburn 1314.
