Written in Latin up to and including 1682.

The church was a perpetual curacy isolated in the year 1671

Sprinkling of illegitimate births throughout the 17th and into the 18th century.

Births: 1677 Margretta filia Jacobi Bouskell et sepulta decimo die ejusdem mensis.

1682 Maria filia George Ashton aspirat in hoc munda

1701 February 14th William son of Agnes Wetherhead, illegitimate

1702 March 21st William son of Agnes Wetherhead, illegitimate

Burials: Register starts 1671

1678 October 17th Matthew Saule "but no affidavit returned to me of being buried in woollen"

1678 October 21st. Edward Bowerdale. "An affidavit received"

1678 January 4th Frances wife of John Bayly of Middleton Head. "An affidavit of her being buried in woollen"

From then on the affidavit continues to be recorded up to April 1679.

1679 November 13th Ann Thornton, a poore child which died in Middleton.

1684 February 9th. Issabell wife of James Troughton "sojuener"

1685 September 25th Lanslet Hodgson sojourner

1704 April 12th Robert Walker a poor boy
