

The Archaeology of Ingleborough Summit  
Saturday 24<sup>th</sup> & Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> July 2010



As our contribution to the Festival of British Archaeology the Ingleborough Archaeology Group (IAG) organised an event aimed to raise the public's awareness of the archaeological features on the summit of Ingleborough and of some of the preservation issues associated with them. It was also an opportunity to provide the latest information on the interpretation of these features.

Interested parties were invited to find their own way to the summit where they were met by members of the IAG for a guided tour. The event was advertised through posters and local press releases.

Over the 2 days a total of 75 people asked to be shown around the summit despite some very challenging weather on the Sunday when visibility was as low as 15m for most of the day. Of those who asked to be shown around, 30 had walked to the summit especially for the event whilst the others had responded to posters placed on the approaches to the summit.

8 IAG members took part in the event which was considered to be very successful and which will probably be repeated in the future.
